I was Captain of the winning Manitoba team in the 1967 Centennial Voyageur Canoe Pageant, a 6,000 km canoe race from Rocky Mountain House to Montreal. There were ten 25' Voyageur Canoes in the event, one from each province except Newfoundland and PEI but included teams from the Yukon and NWT. The youngest paddler was 19 years old and the eldest, 50. There

he Naden Band has been part of naval tradition on the West Coast since 1940. Formed during World War II, the Naden Band kept up both civilian and military morale with concerts, dances and hundreds of radio broadcasts and played for base ceremonies, monthly church parades and public parades through the streets of Victoria and Vancouver. The band also assisted the government in raising money for the war effort through War Bond Drives in Western Canada.

In the decades following World War II, the Naden Band continued to represent the Canadian Forces throughout British Columbia and Canada, receiving acclaim for its performances at events such as the Grey Cup in Vancouver the Kelowna Regatta, Edmonton's Klondike Days and the Calgary Stampede. In travels abroad, the Naden Band became an ambassador for Canada with performances as varied as Expo 70 in Osaka, Japan and accompanying the Provider and the 2nd Canadian Destroyer Squadron in a 1972 tour of Fiji, New Zealand and Australia, as well as participating in an historic visit to Vladivostok, Russia in 1991.

Comprised of 35 professional full-time musicians, the Naden Band's primary role within the RCN is to support Naval Operations, ceremonial







events, and generate public awareness, helping to facilitate a greater understanding of the role the RCN serves in protecting Canada's interests at home and abroad.

The Band performs in a variety of large and small ensembles ranging from symphonic concert band, marching band, jazz band, Dixieland band, rock and contemporary ensembles as well as brass and woodwind quintets.

Within the RCN, the Naden Band performs a number of ceremonial duties such as parades (Remembrance Day, Battle of the Atlantic, Changes of Command) ship departures and arrivals and military dinners. The Band's presence at such events helps to preserve naval customs and traditions while heightening morale and esprit de corps.

Musical support is integral to many Government functions including the opening of the Provincial Legislature, official visits from heads of state and other events in which the Lieutenant Governor, Prime Minister, Governor General or the Royal Family are present.


Music! Performance! Friendship!

During both World Wars and throughout the Cold War, the Salvation Army provided Canadian military personnel overseas and in Canada with comforts such as hot drinks and snacks and helped maintain morale by establishing leave centres for rest and recreation.





100th Anniversary of Vimy Ridge

a defining event for Canada, considered by many contemporaries and later scholars to be a significant event in Canada's progress to full independence from Britain.

The Strategic Importance of Vimy Ridge

The seven-kilometre long Vimy Ridge in Northern France, near Arras, held a commanding view over the surrounding countryside. Previous unsuccessful French and British attacks had suffered over 150,000 casualties.

In early 1917, British High Command ordered the Canadian Corps to capture the position as part of a larger spring offensive in the Arras area. In the coming campaign, British Forces to the south would have limited success, and the French would fail badly, with many of their units reduced to mutiny. The Canadian attack against Vimy Ridge would be spectacular by comparison.

A Planned Battle

Lieutenant-General Sir Julian Byng, the Canadian Corps commander ordered new tactics for the coming assault. Having learned from the Battle of the Somme that intense training better prepared soldiers for what they might find on the battlefield, soldiers were empowered to make quick decisions on their own that were still in keeping with the overall plan. Small units and individual soldiers were given much more information about

he victory at Vimy was the battle, and were expected to exercise initiative in keeping the advance moving forward, even if their officers and NCOs were killed or wounded.

> A tremendous artillery barrage, which included improved techniques for counter-battery fire against enemy guns, would smash German positions and isolate enemy troops in their dugouts.

At 5:30 a.m. on 9 April 2017, Easter Monday, nearly 1,000 guns opened fire on the German positions. An estimated 15,000 Canadians rose from the trenches and advanced towards the ridge in the first wave, with thousands more behind them. Despite hard fighting all across the front, the Canadians captured most of the Ridge on the 9th and the remaining positions by the 12th.

Vimy Ridge as Symbol

Over four days of bloody fighting, the Canadians had overrun Vimy Ridge at the cost of more than 10,600 killed and wounded.

The battle has since become an important symbol for Canada, the place where Canadians from across the country delivered an unprecedented victory, all four divisions of the Canadian Corps fighting together for the first time in the war.

TRIBUTE TO THE VETERANS

In this year's Tattoo, our "Tribute to the Veterans" will focus on the 100th anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge.

Thousands of Canadians died in this battle and many more were wounded. The Ridge was captured. Canadians, fighting together for the first time under their own officers, triumphed. But, at great cost.

The significance of the battle was immense. The sacrifice of our soldiers was heart rending. Many historians claim that this battle and the victory signified the beginning of our country as more than a colony, more than an outpost of Britain and that henceforth this nation could take its place as a significant partner with its allies. Its contribution in 1917 would, they theorized, make Canada even more widely respected politically as well as militarily.

The Canadian Mounted Rifles took part at Vimy and their 'descendant regiment" the British Columbia Dragoons will participate in the Tribute. The Vernon Cadet Training Centre, which has been a military base for over a century, is a mainstay of the Tribute, providing many skilled musicians, drill and Colour Party members. The Royal Canadian Legion, the Army Navy and Air Force Veterans from this city and region participate in the Colour Party and as Flag Bearers. We thank them!

The Kelowna Pipe Band, under the leadership of Pipe Major Chad Goodman is welcomed as they parade in the band's No. 1 uniform. The Drum Major, Ethan Whitla, is a member of that band.

The Salvation Army and the RCMP have been traditional participants in the Tribute. We welcome them back to Kal Tire Place.

Our 2017 Tribute concentrates on Remembrance. Thus, our Tattoo Cenotaph will be the battlefield grave markers supported by appropriate and traditional ceremony.

Should you wish to join in singing the "Good Old Tunes", the words will appear on the large screen.

We look forward to representing BC, and the Okanagan/Thompson area in Glasgow this summer!




he Organizing Committee of the Okanagan Military Tattoo is pleased to welcome back Vernon's own Kalamalka Highlanders Pipe Band.

The Kalamalka Highlanders Pipe Band was formed in 1984 under the direction of Pipe Major Reg Scott who led the Band for 20 years. In fact, the Band still has two pipers playing, including Reg Scott, out of the original group!

Pipe Major Mo Soichuk and Drum Major Neil Morrison lead the Band, while Pipe Sergeants Reg Scott, Gord Mathers, Tom Skinner and Pipe Corporal Dave Gerhardt assist.

The Kalamalka Highlanders is the largest pipe band in the Okanagan Valley with close to 30 pipers and drummers. The Band wears the distinctive maroon and grey Portree tartan from the Isle of Skye in Scotland. The Band is a regular at local celebrations and parades including Vernon Winter Carnival, Lumby Days, the Falkland Stampede and Remembrance Days.
